Henry Johnston, a fine boy of 16 years old, fell
overboard the *Eclair*, of Cardigan, at the New-
quay, on Thursday night, and was drowned. His
body was found yesterday on the arrival of the
Garryowen at the quay, and picked up by her crew.
An inquest was held, and a verdict of "accidental
death" returned.

In the case of *Richardson, v. Rev. William Arthur*
John Preston, a bill filed for account of rents of
Grangeclare, County Kildare, and claim of balance
from defendant, the Lord Chancellor on Wednesday
dismissed the bill with costs, being satisfied that the
defendant was, throughout the whole transaction, in
his effort to relieve an embarrassed neighbour, an
actual friend and benefactor, without any advantage
to himself. The bill his Lordship said, should never
be filed, and its advisers ought to be responsible for
the consequences.

The Court of Exchequer has allowed a conditional
order to set aside the proceedings against Rev. Mr.
O'Connor, of Gort, by the publishers of Lewis's Dic-
tionary, on the grounds of non service.
