of January, 1791. " On the 23d inft. a desperate affray took blace between the light infantry company of the 58th regiment of foot quartered here, and some of the butchers and boatmen belonging to this rown, the cause of which was as follows :- A burcher having stelen a game-cock from one of the foldiers, was fighting it on the above day, and the owner being prefent, instantly demanded his cock, on which he was knocked Jown, and a riot enfined .- Capt. Christmas of the 18th dragoons, and Lieut. Crowgey of the 58th, coming up to make peace, were knocked down, and Capt. Christmas had his scull fractured, and the bridge of his note broken, Mr. Crowgey received several blows with stones; however, the foldlers were ordered to their rooms, But in some time after the mob pursued, and threw leveral vollies of stones in at the barrack windows, when the men were at supper, which cut three or four of them in the head in a defperate manner, on which fome of the foldiers loaded their pieces with powder, and fired into the street, which further enraged the mob, who by this time procured muskets and fired balls in at the windows, on which the foldiers returned the fire with ball-cartridge, killed two young women, one of whom was fervant to Capt. Christmas, and wounded several of the rioters, who have fince fled from this town." Extract of a letter from Dundalk, Jan. 30.

" A most shocking transaction took place on Friday night last at Forkhill, within two miles of this town; at the dead hour of the night the house of the parish school-master was furrounded by a banditti, who, having broke in, rook the man, his wife, and their fon, a boy of fourteen years old, and cut their tongues out of their heads; after which they took the father and mother and choped their fingers off.
