change of clothing, dietary, &c.; but the Mayor,
Messrs. Watson and Barron, county magistrates, with
Sub-Inspector Williams, and city police, having made
their appearance, and evinced a stern determination to
preserve the peace, it had the effect of restoring order
amongst the malcontents. A body of constabulary
remain on duty at the workhouse.

Messrs. Harvey's large store, Upper William-street,
was taken this day by the Guardians for an auxiliary
workhouse, and will be ready for the admission of
some hundred paupers on Saturday. There were 115
admitted yesterday to the parent and auxiliary work-
houses. The total of inmates, this day, is 6,850!

A crowd of hungry persons, male and female, at-
tacked and plundered two bread carts in the Irish-
town yesterday morning, from the concerns of Mr.
Bannatyne, and Mr. Ryan, of Bruree. The offence
would have been repeated but for the appearance of
the police in the locality, and who this morning es-
corted the bread-carts to their customers.

This evening a mob of fellows broke several shop
windows in the Irish Town, which had provisions, and
ran away with loaves of bread, &c. All the shops of
St. Mary's and St. John's are now closed up by the
owners, for protection.

Mr. Acheson Lyle has succeeded the late Dr. El-
rington as a member of the Endowed Schools founda-
tion, and Master Murphy is appointed to the National
education board in room of Mr. Corballis.

engaged in the expedition to Egypt in 1801, under
General Abercrombie and Admiral Lord Keith.

An inquest was held at Garryfine, in this county
before John Cox, Esq., Coroner, on the body of Patk,
Gore, found dead on the road side, on the morning of
the 7th inst. It appeared this poor man left his home,
at Coleman's-well, an hour and a half before day same
morning, with the view of going to seek relief or ad-
mission to the Kilmallock workhouse, and unfortu-
nately fell by the way-side, where he perished. The
jury returned a verdict "that he came by his death
from destitution and the inclemency of the weather."
No blame, however, is to be attached to the Reliev-
ing officer, as he had given a ticket of admission to
the poor man for self and family; but his wife refused
to accompany him to the poorhouse, and he was then
going to make an effort for out-door relief.

Honora Jourdan and Patrick Crowe, the alleged
parents of an infant found murdered in a haggard,
near Bruree, last week, and Johanna Hore, the mother
of Crowe, are committed to the County gaol by
Joseph R. Grace, Esq. R. M. for being concerned in
that crime. Much credit is due to Mr. Carey, S. I.
Bruff, and Head-Constable Graham, of Bruree, for
tracing out this revolting outrage.
