Thos. S. Reeves, Esq. is to be Foreman of the City  
Grand Jury.  
Viscountess Gort attended the drawing-room at  
Dublin Castle on Thursday night.  
Last night an armed party attacked the habitation  
of Mr. Patrick Coghlan, a respectable farmer in Old  
England, and fired two balls into the house, and dis-  
charged another shot outside, after posting a threaten-  
ing notice for him.  
The store of Mr. Joseph Robinson, in Mungret-  
street, was forcibly entered last night, and robbed of  
some silver. The burglars failed in a desperate effort  
to break the iron safe in the office.  
Acting Constable Campbell has been detached in  
charge of a party of the City Police to Corbally, where  
new barracks are being fitted up for them.  
Thomas Griffin is lodged in our county Gaol for  
detention of a female at Loughill, a few weeks since.  
A meeting of the Freemen and Protestants of Dub-  
lin, convened by the Lord Mayor, to petition against  
the Municipal Corporation Reform Bill, took place  
yesterday at the Board Room of the Mansion House.  
The speakers were Messrs. Hamilton, Lefanue, Pro-  
fessor Butt, Alderman Warren, Rev. H. Prior, Mr.  
West, Rev. Mr. Gregg, Mr. Holmes, Mr. Archer and  
Mr. Nash. Resolutions were passed to resist any  
further concession of power to the Church of Rome,  
protest against the Municipal Corporations' bill, as  
a violation of chartered rights, a measure of disfran-  
chisement and confiscation, and calling on the repre-  
sentatives of Irish Protestants to vote against it.  
After appointing a deputation, Messrs. Jones, Butt,  
Eveler, and Gregg, to proceed to England, to enlist  
the feeling of their Fellow-Protestants against the  
progress of the bill, the meeting concluded with a  
vote of thanks to the Lord Mayor.
