Sunday night last, Thomas Kennedy was barbarously mur-
dered at the cross of Askeaton lead ng to Rathkeale, where his
remains exhibited most revolting evidence of the ferocity of
his assailants. The brains of the unfortunate man protruded
in large portions through two or three fractures in the head,
which the fingers could easily penetrate, while his features
were quite disfigured with blood and puddle. The brother
of Kennedy was murdered at the fair of Stonehall by those
of an opposite faction, the Downes and Kennedys having
for some years cherished a deadly animosity against each
other. Monday evening John E. Langford, Esq. an active
Magistrate of that district, with Constable Morris of the
Peace Preservation Police, Constable Lynch of Stonehall,
and Maher of the Askeaton Constabulary, apprehended two
men of the name of Byrnes, and one of the name of Leary,
as participators in the above horrible outrage. The sanctity
of the Sabbath, the sitting of the Assizes for trial and punish-
ment of criminals, and the fact of the Judges who held his
Majesty's commission being within a few miles of the a rocious
miscreants, could not deter them from this bloody deed.
Reckless as they are of human as well as divine law, the
ignominy of the scaffold can alone make them sensible of
such enormous guilt.
