Yesterday, John Singleton, Esq. arrived at his seat

On Tuesday, James Butler, of Drumclogher,
about three miles from Cappamore, went into a field
where his tenant, William Leahy, was employed
digging mud out of a trench for the purpose of
manure. Butler was remonstrating against the work,
and after some altercation Leahy struck Butler with
his spade on the head so violently, as to fracture the
sku'l, and cause his immediate death. Sub-inspector
Mark O'Mally Burke, and his orderly, Sullivan, pur-
sued and arrested the offender, just as he was starting
off to evade justice. The Coroner, James Bennett,
Esq. held an inquest, and the verdict was wilful
murder against Leahy, who is committed and will be
arraigned at the present assizes.

The inaugural address of Sir Aubrey De Vere, on
