On Thursday night, four men (armed,) knocked at the door of a poor man, named Kean, residing on the lands of Caheravalla, in the South Liberties, and about three miles from this City, demanding admittance as Policemen, and stating that they wanted to search for strangers, reported to them to have been secreted there. The poor man, believing their story, opened the door, when one of the party put a blunderbuss to his mouth and threatened to shoot him, if he did not go into bed, which he complied with, and that man continued to watch over him, while the others proceeded to rifle the house of every article of wearing apparel and 11s. 9d in money, with which they went off. The owner of the house, finding them gone, got up and dressed himself, and ran into town to the Police-office, where he partially told his story, when four Policemen were dispatched with him. On reaching the head of William-street, near the Artillery Barracks, (where the two roads meet,) the Policemen very properly considered that the robbers might come into town the contrary road to which they were then going, and accordingly divided their party on each road, two and two, when, in a very short time after, the four robbers approached, and Kean recognised them; two were secured, the others ran away. They were brought to the Police-office, where it was immediately ascertained who a third of the gang was, and he also was shortly after secured at his lodgings in the Lishtown, and fully identified as the man who presented the blunderbuss at Kean. Thus a noted gang of robbers, residing in this City, have been completely broken up, and will meet that punishment which their crimes deserve at the approaching Assizes.

Richard Nagle, charged with stealing boots, died of a decline in the hospital of the City Jail, on Thursday night. He was for trial at the Assizes.

An inquest having been held on the body of John M'Auliffe, found dead a few nights ago, near Annagan, in this Co. returned the following verdict:—"We find, from the severity of the night, that he came to his death by the visitation of God."

A lunatic, named Kelly, from the Co. Limerick, threw himself into the river at Cork, on Wednesday, and was drowned.

Darby Considine was found drowned in the river at Ennis, on Monday night.—He fell in whilst drunk.

Two out-houses, adjoining the Fever Hospital, Ennis, were nearly consumed by an accidental fire, on Tuesday night.
