Spain and Louisiana, and then negotiating
peace.

The following interesting commercial informa-
tion has been received at Amsterdam from Spain:
The Royal Consular Tribunal was made known
to the Royal Council of Commerce at Catalonia
by an order of Dec. 31 last, and which was
communicated by his Excellency Don Miguel
de Solar, Secretary of State and of the Ge-
neral Bureau of Finances. It runs thus: in order
to prevent all unpleasantness which the misinterpre-
tation given in some custom-houses of Spain, to the
order of Nov. 19 last, may occasion, and in
order to limit the obligation to exhibit certificates
of Consuls, confirming from whence the foreign
merchandise imported into Spain have their ori-
gin, his Majesty has thought proper to declare
that the said Royal Resolution, are not compre-
hended at the time of issuing said Royal Order.
