DUBLIN, March 15.

Yellerday a deputation, appointed by delco gates from the body of the Roman Catholics of Ireland, waited on the Secretary at the Callie with a copy of a perition which that body of the people mean to prefent to Parliament.

We hear that the above petition is for a relaxation of the Penal Laws against the Roman Catholics, in order to attain the support of gevernment.

The Earl of Fingal headed the deputation from the Roman Catholics, who yesterday waited on the Secretary.

Tho' the effence of bark was faid to have failed in the first experiment for tanning hides or fkins, yet it is highly probable; that upon fartner trials, it might be found to answer the purpose intended. Some unskilful mode adopted in the process, or perhaps some neglect in the persons employed by the tanner, might have occasioned the failure alluded to. This, however, is evident, that it is the effence contained in the bark which alone effects the tannage; large quantities might be procured, every year from America, at a comparatively cheap price to what is now paid, but otherwife, the freightage of fuch an article, in a rough state, coming such a distance, and being fo bulky, would render it much too dear.

Tuesday, eight men and three women under fentence of transportation, arrived here from Armagh and Monaghan; and yesterday they were transmitted hence to Cork, to fail for Botany Bay.

There will be an eclipse of the fun on the 3d of next month, which will be visible to all Europe, part of Asia, Atrica and America. To the north of Scotland it will be a very great ecliple-but no where total, on account of the apparent diameter of the moon, at that time, being lee than the apparent diameter of the fun (the moon being near her Apogee); therefore; along the track of central appearance, the spectators will be entertained with a beautiful Annulus, or ring of light, encompaffing the opaque body of the moon on every fide .-This beautiful appearance will pass over Iceland, where they will be entertained with this hovel light about 12 o'clok at noon. This central and annular appearance first begins with the riling fun in the back fettlements of Carolina and Virginia; from whence it traverses Hudson's Bay, north-easterly, towards the coast of Greenland, Iceland, and Lapland, and the northern coast of Great Tantary, where this phæ omenon will end, and quit the earth with the feiring fun.

On the morning of Saturday the 12th inft was feized near the Bay of Liscannor, in the West of the Co. Clare, by Meffes. Stritch and Murray Excise Officers, and Mr. Slattery preventi g Officer, affilted by a detachment of the 69th Regiment, now lying at Clare Calle, a great quantity of fmuggled Tobacco and Whifkey, &c. where they broke feveral machines for manufacturing robacco, and deftroyed two extenfive private Diffilleries, one of which on the fpot, where fometime ago a large party of his Majefty's troops, were beat off and deprived of their arms; much credit is due to Lieuts.
