

FUNERAL OF MR E. J. BAIRD.

The remains of the late Mr. E. J. Baird, Manager of the Newcastle West Branch of the Provincial Bank were interred in Ballintemple Cemetery on Monday. The cortege was of very large proportions and a striking demonstration of the esteem and regard in which the deceased gentleman was held in the town and district. While the sad procession was passing through the streets, houses were closed and on every side the deepest regret was felt for the loss of one who since his connection with the locality, extending over many years, endeared himself to all, without distinction of class.
