

In the quantity of potatoes to this market last week there was an increase of 58 loads. There were 200 loads on Saturday last in the market area.

Emigration is again amazingly on the increase, not however, so much to Canada as to the United States and the train from this to Dublin is daily crowded with intending emigrants, mostly all agricultural, and who embark for their destination at Liverpool. The banks in Limerick are hourly paying out money upon the orders remitted by the friends of those people in America, who emigrated the last and preceding years.

There are nine vessels at the quays taking passengers—three for New York, and six for Quebec.
