House of Industry, that useful Charity has been neg-  
lected by those who are representatives of the Public;  
altho' it has been conducted with such strict oeconomy,  
as to relieve and support above 2000 poor, at less than  
two-pence a day, for each. And no doubt if it re-  
ceived a proper annual supply, but every poor person  
in the County and City would be effectually relieved.—  
It is an excellent institution planned by the wisdom of  
the Legislature. It has already produced the happiest  
effects, and all the shafts of ignorant censure leveled  
against it, must fall to the Ground. And confident we  
are, if the respectable Gentlemen who compose our  
County and City Grand Juries, were to examine that  
House, it would call up all their finer feelings to exert  
themselves in its ample support, which would fall easy  
on individuals, and not be the twentieth-penny of what  
the English pay to support their poor. To see the aged  
poor lame and blind relieved—to see the reduced citizen  
and house-keeper supported—to behold the lunatics  
taken care of, and prevented from being a burden to  
their families and a nuisance to the public—to contribute  
to a House capable of rescuing 400 of our fellow-crea-  
tures from the very depth of human misery—must have  
a strong claim on our humanity, and animate every  
man to support an institution, which wants only the  
aid pointed out by Parliament, to be extensively and  
truly useful to Society, especially as all sturdy Beggars  
are forced to earn their own maintenance.
