port of the House of Industry. Stat. 11. and 12 Geo. 111. Cap. 30. - And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, in order to create fome Revenues for the faid Corporations at the out-fet, That the Grand Juries of every County, County of a City, and County of a Town in this Kingdom respectively, for ever, may, and they are hereby authorized and required at every Spring Affizes to be held in the faid Counties respectively, after the twelfth Day of February, in the Year of our Lord, one Thouland feven Hundred and feventy-three, to prefent in every County of a City or Town, to be raifed by Presentment from off the Lands and Houses in that County, equally and rateably, before the first Day of November then next following, any Sum not less than One Hundred Pounds, nor more than Two Hundred Pounds; and from off the Lands and Houses of every County at large as aforefaid, any Sum not less than Two Hundred Pounds, nor more than Four Hundred Pounds, to be paid to the Corporations of the said Counties respectively, or to their Treasurers respect vely, w thout any fee or deduction whatfoever, for the charitable purpotes aforefaid, and to be affeffed and collected as other County Taxes are; and for the laid Tax hereby imposed, the Collectors thereof are hereby required to give to those who pay it, Receipts separate and dist not from those given for other Taxes."
