has presented a petition from the Assize Grand Jury for an amendment of the Irish Poor-law-bill, but I fear that it is too far gone in committee through the Commons for any practical improvement, unless the House of Lords take up the whole subject, and it is most probable they will either reject the bill at once, or materially alter its leading provisions. Mr. Roche explained the heavy local taxation under which proprietors and tenantry in the liberties of Limerick suffer by the unequal burden of taxes on landed property, and he illustrated the prayer of the Grand Jury that the support of public institutions should bear equally upon property at large.

"The second reading of the Irish medical charities' bill, in which the faculty and public generally at your side are so deeply interested, comes on the 28th inst. (Wednesday.)

We trust the report is correct that Major Warburton will be appointed Inspector-General of Constabulary, in the place of Colonel Shaw Kennedy, resigned. We consider that for such a situation the holder should be an Irishman, well acquainted with the ispositions of the people, their wants, their prejudices, and their failings; for without that information it is next to impossible to carry on the duties of the situation as they ought to be; and for these reasons we hope to see Major Warburton, who has made himself efficient and deservedly popular with all ranks and with all parties, selected for the vacancy. It should be recollected that an act of injustice was perpetrated against Major Warburton, the senior Inspector of the Constabulary, under the old act, by the appointment of Colonel Shaw Kennedy over his head.
