An industrious aged farmer of the name of Sylvester Murphy, was barbarously murdered on Saturday night, at Gurtamera-Bridge, near Cahirconlish. The assailants broke his skull in different places, and his arm also. The unoffending poor man was over 70 years of age. James Bennett, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest upon his remains, when a verdict of wilful murder was returned against two fellows who are since in custody.

The mail coach from this city to Waterford was upset at Woodroof, on Monday night, by coming in contact with a tree which had been left on the road after being felled. The coachman received some severe contusions—the passengers escaped uninjured.

Charles Wilson, sailer of the Sarah merchant vessel, fell out of a small boat yesterday between the Pool and Mead's Quay, after putting the pilot a-shore, and was drowned.—The body was found shortly after, and an inquest held by the Mayor. Verdict—Accidental Death.

Two boys were shockingly burned yesterday morning by the premature blast of gun-powder in a quarry.

A miserable poor woman has been received into the district Lunatic Asylum this week from Tralee gaol, having been charged at last Assizes with the murder of her two children, but was acquitted immediately, as it appeared she was a confirmed lunatic when destroying her offspring.

On Patrick's day a poor man was battered to death with stones by some drunken ruffians, at Kilgarvan, Kerry.

Milner Barry, Esq. of Scahana, was attacked on the road near Watergrass-hill, Cork, on Monday evening, by six ruffians who seized the bridle and attempted to drag him off his horse, but he fired at, and wounded the foremost, when the others instantly fled.

As two of the Rathcannon police were patrolling in the direction of Clonyharp, Tipperary, on Patrick's night, they heard a report of shots; on getting into the field whence the shots proceeded, a shot, which wounded him in the leg, was fired at one of the policemen, the comrade of this policeman immediately fired at the fellow, and shot him dead.

The house of the Misses Hunt, near Thurles, was robbed by seven armed men on Friday night.

At a highly respectable meeting, held on Wednesday, at Clonmel, the Hon. Cornelius O'Callaghan in the Chair, and Counsellor Grene, Secretary, the following resolution was adopted:—"That being fully impressed with the conviction that a simultaneous and combined effort on part of the magistrates, gentry, and farmers, is alone wanted to efface every trace of agrarian outrages and factious riots in this county, we pledge ourselves to use our most strenuous exertions to effect a moral combination of all classes to carry such an object into effect."
