## TO-DAY'S TELEGRAMS.

### THE COAL TRADE DISPUTE.

Another attempt to settle the Welsh coal dispute was made at Cardiff to-day, owners and men's representatives again conferring, as the outcome of the intervention of Mr. Euxton, President of the Board of Trade. Even if no settlement is reached to-day there is the possibility of the strike being deferred; the men continuing upon day-to-day contracts after the 31st instant. Prior to the Board assembling to-day each side held a private meeting. The strike has already had serious effects through a diversion of trade.

The Northumberland Miners' Executive to-day decided to pay a further strike allowance to the miners of the idle collieries till April 2nd.

### MID-GLAMORGAN ELECTION.

Mr. F. W. Gibbins, Liberal, and Mr. Vernon Hartshorne, Labour, were to-day nominated for Mid-Glamorgan.

### YOUNG MEN'S CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION.

The death is announced of Mr. William Cress, of Tebbington, Tewksbury, the first hon. secretary of the original Young Men's Christian Association, formed in 1844. Deceased was one of the first associates of the late Mr George Williams in the formation of the Young Men's Christian Association, and was the only surviving member of the first Association.
