AWFUL CATASTROPHE.—Wednesday night last, three young children were burned to death in the cabin of a poor man named Egan, in the village of Herbertstown, in this County. The eldest girl rose by desire of her mother to light a rush, to see how one of the young children lay in bed, immediately over which was placed a parcel of dry flax.—The flame of the rush light communicated with this inflammable material, and the little cabin was in a blaze of fire in less than five minutes. The father, mother, and one child escaped from the flames severely burnt, but the remainder of their helpless progeny perished in the conflagration, with all the little property of which they were possessed. The poor father had borrowed clothes to cover him next day, when interring the sad remains of his three children, and the mother and surviving child are since received in a deplorable state in the County Hospital.

Friday morning it blew a most tempestuous gale from the west, and the tide rose to a great height, covering the lower quays, and doing much damage to boats and small craft. A western sail-boat, corn laden, swamped near the Ferry-slip, and it required the most strenuous exertions of the mariners in port to hold fast the large vessels moored at the quays. The weather has since improved.

Yesterday, John Keffe, John Hammond, John Meehan, Timothy Quaide, and Michael O'Donnell, were brought into this City from Rathkeale, under a strong escort of the 85th Regiment, charged with being principals and instigators in the late disgraceful riot and outrage at the Special Tythe Sessions of that town, for assaulting the Police, destroying the documents of the Court, and injuring the interior of the Sessions house, from which Mr. Ardill, the presiding Barrister, and his officers, were obliged to fly before brute force. It is expected those daring miscreants will be tried at the adjourned Assizes, and punished for such a flagrant violation of the law.

There are 48 prisoners standing over for trial at the County Limerick adjourned Assizes, including seven for murder, nine for riotous assembly in arms, four for abduction, two for robbery of arms, one for female violation, one for concealing the birth of a child, seven for violent assault and demolishing a house, two for attacking the Police and breaking the barrack windows, one for sheep stealing, and the remainder for assault and larceny.

Baron Foster arrived in town this evening from Cork, to resume the county assize trials on Monday next. His Lordship will attend divine service in the Cathedral to-morrow.

Monday next the General Quarter Sessions for this County commence before Assistant-Barrister Cruise at Rathkeale, where two companies of the 60th Rifles are now stationed to prevent disturbance.
