DEATH OF MAJOR PETER G. GRIFFIN, D.S.O.

Numerous friends in the County Limerick will learn with regret of the death, which took place at Cairo on the 26th instant, of Major Peter Gerald Griffin, D.S.O., R.F.A. Details to hand are meagre, but it is known that the sad event was the result of a Polo accident. The deceased, who was the eldest son of the late Mr Peter G. Griffin, J.P., Altavilla, County Limerick, was aged 42, and had seen much service in the late war, in which he was awarded the D.S.O.

DEATH OF MR PATRICK RYAN

The death, which we announce with regret, took place yesterday at his residence, Farnane House, Murroe, of Mr Patrick Ryan. The deceased had been ailing only a few days, and his early demise has come as a great shock to his relatives. He was unmarried, and aged about 45 years.
