Thursday last Mrs. Johanna Hackett, of Newcastle, dropt dead; she was in perfect health and attending her business up to the time she expired.

On Monday an inquest was held at Ballymackey, within a few miles of Nenagh, on the bodies of Patrick Hasset, a farmer, and his son, aged 2½ years. By evidence it appeared the unfortunate man was laboring under insanity when he drowned his child and then destroyed himself in the same manner.

Coroner, when the Jury returned a verdict that Margaret Hayes concealed the birth of the child, and was thereby instrumental in causing its death.
