houses to the Housing Committee, with a view to increasing the rents.

The Mayor, referring to a recommendation to provide £2s in the £ for the erection of houses under the terms offered by the Provisional Government, said he was in Dublin recently, and had an interview with Alderman Congrave, Minister for Local Government, on the subject. He was informed by the Minister that the grant for building was being given on the basis of a 1s rate throughout the whole of Ireland, and in that way he had set the amount for Limerick at £30,000. He (Mayor) asked him if there were not places that would not take advantage of the Government's terms, and he said there were not. He then pointed out that Limerick Corporation had provided for a 2s rate, and was told that the equivalent of such a rate would not be forthcoming. That being so, he (Mayor) considered the Council should strike a rate of 1s for housing, with an additional 6d to provide for the repayment of the loan.

Mr O'Flynn proposed, and Mr J. A. Moloney seconded, that the Council strike a rate of 1s in the £ for housing in the city, and 6d to meet the repayment of principal and interest on the loan. This was agreed to.

The Council reduced the estimate for mac-
phalting from 1s to 6d in the £, and having
made other deductions the following rate was
unanimously adopted to meet the services of the
city for the ensuing year—Improvement rate of
1s in the £; domestic water rate, 1s 6d;
Borough rate, 6d; poor rate, 6s 8d, and general
purposes rate, 3s 4d, making a total of 23s, as
compared with 27s 2d for the last twelve months.

The Council, on the motion of Mr D Bourke,
seconded by Mr M Griffin, increased the rate for
the upkeep of the Free Library and Museum by
one penny in the pound.

THE SHREAVALTY.

The question of selecting three persons qualified
to fill the office of High Sheriff for the ensuing
period was again adjourned pending a com-
munication on the subject from Daill Riireann.

THE LATE CAPTAIN T. KEANE.

was attended by a large congregation.
