 "That the functions of the Commissioners of this Parish having been for 20 years exercised to the advan- tage of its inhabitants. We cannot for a moment entertain a proposition, the result of which would be the extinction of so beneficial a body. But resolved that we shall at all times be ready to contribute a fair proportion not exceed- ing £1000 in the whole, in aid of the general expendi- ture of the Liberties and City at large, and shall accord- ingly; especially in consequence of an accession of ex- pence arising from the institution of new establish- ments, such as the Lunatic Asylum, Police, &c. &c. consent to such an enlargement of our powers, under the 51st Geo. III. as will enable us to raise in addition to the £500 late Irish currency, there authorised a fair sum not exceeding in the whole the before mentioned sum of £1000."

We have to request the kind attention of our fellow- citizens to the destitute state of the unemployed Cotton Weavers, a most industrious and well-conducted class of men. A public fund is now being raised for their relief, in order to furnish employ to some, and perhaps to enable others to emigrate. Either object must be a good one, and we earnestly solicit the co-operation of the affluent and humane in their behalf.

The Relief Committee of Cork have resolved to fur- nish twenty-four of the best conducted and unmarried cotton weavers, out of employ in that City, with funds to convey them to Manchester, where the trade is now growing brisk.

The fair of Castle-Connell, on Easter Monday, will be worth the attention of farmers and jobbers. A large exhibition of stock will be made; Cotraging will finish the day's amusement.
