off under a military escort on Monday morning.

M'Grath, Wm. Clarke, Patrick Dwyer, William Dwyer.

Timothy Sullivan, a labourer at the Wellesley bridge works,
fell off part of the stone embankment forming at the Strand
side of the river yesterday evening, and was drowned. We
are informed that a culpable apathy and indifference was
evinced by the other workmen who saw him fall into the
water, and made no exertion to save him, either by throwing
out a rope or plank to his relief.

A boy named James Meara, living at Garryowen, went
into a field at five o'clock this morning, for an ass that was
out grazing. The animal attacked the poor lad most furiously,
first having knocked him down by a kick on the breast, and
then he caught the boy's right hand in his mouth, which he
lacerated most terribly, and broke both the bones. The
animal also bit a large piece out of the boy's thigh. He is
under treatment in the City Infirmary.
