**LIMERICK UNION.**—The Guardians met to-day at the office, Thomas-st., D. Cullen, V.P., in the chair. A long recriminating discussion arose on a motion brought forward by Mr. J. M'Carthy—"That outdoor relief, as heretofore, be given to the aged and infirm." However, the following resolution (as an amendment) proposed by Mr. Croker, of Ballinagard, seconded by Mr. John W. Mahony, was carried by a majority of *three*, there being 17 for, and 14 against it—"That it is inexpedient to make any rule for relief, either in-door or out-door, with reference to any particular class, as each case must be considered only on its individual merits. The Board of Guardians is bound to give relief agreeably to the legal discretion vested in the vote of the majority of the Guardians present, when the application of the persons requiring

At the Police-office, this day, Mary Ryan, larceny of a sheet, informations ordered; Michael Earls, charged with being drunk, and breaking of ware in one of the "dens" in Post-office-lane, was sentenced to 2s. 6d. or 48 hours for being drunk, and 10s. or 21 days for malicious injury, and 21 days more for assault on Police; informations were ordered against Peter Ahern, for forcibly entering the house of Ellen Ahern and taking her property; Wm.
