The Break of Day, Captain Moore, 1,800 tons, which sailed from Liverpool on the 7th April, with upwards of 900 emigrants for Boston, has put into Cork in distress, lost her fore, main, and mizen top-masts, and top-gallant masts. On the night of the 2d of May, the Captain jumped overboard and was drowned.

A very large sum has been paid in duty on whiskey, on the apprehension that an additional shilling duty will be proposed by the Chancellor, and which has been realised since.

Whiskey was this day advanced at Thomondgate distillery from 7s. 8d. to 8s. 4d. per gallon ; at Cork distillery agency stores, same price ; and Dublin from 9s. 6d. to 10s. 6d. per gallon.

The distillers of Cork have fixed the price of whiskey at 8s 2d per gallon, being only an advance of 6d per gallon. The distillers have reduced the short price 4d.

In the last month Dublin exported 9,400 barrels of porter.

On Sunday night, Martin Hickey, a shoemaker from Ahane, near Annacotty, came into Limerick in a state of beastly intoxication, and was put to bed in the house of his uncle (a vender of oranges) who resides in Creagh lane, with a married couple. About two o'clock next morning, when the man near whom he slept, put his hand over to feel if Hickey was covered he found the body quite cold, and upon further examination the wretched man was dead.

The body of a miserably clad woman, name unknown, aged about 50 years, was found in a ditch, near Blackwater, on Monday morning, in a state of decomposition. The Police conveyed the remains to Ardnacrusha where an inquest was held by Mr. Canny, Coroner, and after *post mortem* examination by Dr. Going, a verdict was returned that she died from want of the necessaries of life, and exposure to cold.
