

THE KING - A PROCLAMATION.

Majesty's pleasure touching his Royal Coronation, and the Solemnity thereof. R. We have resolved by the favour and blessing of God to celebrate the birthday of our Royal Coronation, the first day of August next, at our Westminster; and forasmuch as by ancient custom, as also in regard of divers tenures of vassalry and other hereditaments, many of our loving subjects are bound to do and perform divers services on the said day, and at the time of the Coronation times precedent taste unbecomingly, and thereby cause have done and performed at the Coronation our progenitors and predecessors. We out of our sincere care for the preservation of our lawful rights and inheritances of our loving subjects, have thought fit to give and publish our Resolutions therein; and we do hereby further signify that by our Commission at Seal of Great Britain, we have appointed our most Dear Brothers and faithful Counsellors, Duke of York, William Henry, Duke of Devonshire, Augustus Frederick, Duke of Sussex; our most Dear and faithful Counsellor, William Frederick, our most Dear Cousin and faithful Prince Leopold, of Saxe-Coburg, and the most honorable Privy Council, of any here present, to receive, hear, and determine the petitions which shall be to them exhibited by any subjects in this behalf.

GOD SAVE THE KING.

Lord of Donoughmore was re-sworn in, at the Court, on Saturday. A Member of his Privy Council. Mr. Vesey Fitzgerald sworn a Member at the same time. General Hutchinson was introduced to the Court, on Saturday last, by Count Sidmouth, when his Majesty was pleased to confer the honor of Knighthood on him. King's Levee, on Saturday, Lieutenant-General Sir Henry Tucker Montresor, lately to command in Dublin, received the honor of Knight Commander. Major-General Sir Thomas Brisbane, commanding this District, arrived here, Friday morning, at half-past seven o'clock,

for which were as follows:—Boland, 10s; Westropp, 102; Perry, 71.

Thursday John Coker, jun. Esq. was elected President of the new Committee of Merchants, Cork, and as a further mark of distinction to that Gentleman, a piece of plate was voted to him, for his indelible zeal on all occasions in promoting the Mercantile interests of that City.

The Exporting Merchants of Cork have rendered public thanks to Edward Hegarty, Esq. (lately appointed Justice at Belfast,) for his attention and excellent conduct, as Shipping Officer, for a series of years.

In the Court of Exchequer, on Tuesday, the case Galway v. Daly, Agent at Cork to the Atlas Co. which was tried at the last Co. Kerry Assizes, was discussed on some points saved by Defendant, which were ruled by the Court in favor of the Plaintiff.

The Counting-house of Messrs. Commins, near Patrick's Bridge, Cork, was entered through the roof and ceiling, on Tuesday night, and robbed of several bills of exchange.

On Sunday night last, the out house of Mr. John McMahon, Post Master of Pailis-Grain, was broken into, and some depredations committed.

Rewards amounting to near £300, are offered in this days publication, for the apprehension of the perpetrators who maliciously consumed, on the night of the 4th inst. a dwelling house, on the lands of Anon, in this County, part of the Lord Chancellor's estate.

Yesterday, John Howard, day man to Tucker's Brewery, in this City, was killed near Crough, by the horse and cart going over his body; he was strictly honest, and was wounded at the battle of Traalgar.

Mr Thomas Ryan, of Roche's-Street, fell yesterday, in Bedford-row, from a scaffold, 13 feet high, and was severely injured.

At the fair of Ballinastoe on Monday, black cattle were from £2 to £3 higher than last year, and in great demand: sheep in proportion, and in much demand, as it appeared there was a scarcity.

The Meeting called on Monday, for the purpose of endeavouring to establish a Mendicity in this town was so thinly attended, or rather so completely unattended, that it was obliged to be adjourned.—Karis Paper.
