

An order of Council was passed on Wednesday the 17th inst. to permit ships and vessels to Africa to take on board gun-powder, trading pistols, with bars and shot as the exporters think necessary, notwithstanding any thing contained in his Majesty's order in Council of the 17th of April last.

In the motion of Col. Bagwell, in the House of Commons, on Wednesday, May 11, it was ordered, that the Clerks of the Peace for the different Counties of Ireland be ordered to lay before the Court the returns of the number of Freeholders in their respective Counties.

Yesterday, orders were issued by his Excellency the Commissioners of the Revenue, to prevent the export of any ship, either foreign or domestic, from clearing until further orders.

And on the preceding night similar directions, to the same effect, were dispatched from the Secretary's Office to all the out-ports; so that by this day all vessels in port throughout this part of the Kingdom, except the regular packets, are detained.

The Trial of Garrison will be reviewed by his Excellency at the Phoenix Park, on the 23d inst. On the adjournment of the Sessions was before the Recorder, when the following persons were found guilty:

Matthew Forde, for having in his possession certificates, purporting to be notes of the Governor and Company of the Bank of Ireland, well known to be false and counterfeited.

He was sentenced to be whipped from Newgate to the Exchange, to be fined 50s. and imprisoned for 6 months.

The Recorder addressed the High Sheriff, in a very animated speech, in which he expatiated on the enormity of the offence, of which the prisoner had been convicted, on the most clear, and satisfactory evidence; and ordered, that his sentence should be effectually carried into execution; and that a mockery of justice! such, as he had too often observed to be the case. That, if his executioner should not do his duty, he should either oblige him to do so, or execute the sentence himself—for, that he would admit of no apology for the least neglect in the execution of so mild a sentence, for an offence, which he lamented the law had not made a felony, which would subject the offender to transportation.

Nicholas Mahane was next put on his trial for collecting taxes, under pretence of having a warrant for that purpose. He was convicted on two counts, for defrauding different persons, in one of which he called himself Johnson. He was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment (six months on each count) and to be whipped on Saturday next, from the Gaol to the Exchange.

Yesterday evening, Thomas Gleeson, of Cullinstown, in this County, mason, was brought in by a party of the 72d Regiment, and committed to the County Jail, by the Rev. William Massey, of Tipperary, being charged on oath before said Magistrate, with having (previous to the intended attack on Limerick) headed a party, who forcibly entered the house of Robert Bradshaw, of Prospect, Esq; and thereout feloniously stole three guns; and then proceeding with said party, as Captain, to Pallis, to unite with a number of ruffians there assembled, for the purpose of attacking the City of Limerick, some time in January last;—he is further charged with having administered illegal oaths to several of that party then under his command.
