FUNERAL OF MR P HARTIGAN

This morning, at 11 o'clock, Requiem Mass was
 celebrated at St Michael's Catholic Church for the
 late Mr Patrick Hartigan, whose death took place
 on Wednesday night. Last evening the remains
 were removed from the Royal George Hotel,
 O'Connell-street, to the church, where they
 rested overnight. The Rev Fr Carroll, C.C,
 St Michael's, was celebrant of the Mass;
