

Mr. BAKER said the country bankers dealt in a very profitable commodity, namely, the commodity of paper; it was a thriving trade, he said, if an opinion was to be formed by the increase of country banks; he therefore gave this tax his hearty assent.

Mr. Alderman WATSON said, the proposed regulations had been long known to the public and as no objection had come to his knowledge from his constituents, to any of the proposed duties, he should give them his approbation.

The motion for repealing the old duties was then put, and carried.

NEW DUTIES.

The CHAN. of the EXCHEQUER then moved the following resolutions, which were agreed to:

That it is the opinion of this committee, that a sum not exceeding three pence, be laid upon every bill of exchange, or other note, or draft, or order, payable on demand, where the sum shall amount to 40s. and not exceed 5l. 5s. and which shall not be re-issuable for payment thereof, at any other place than where the name was first issued.

9d. from 30l. to 50l.

1s. from 50l. to 100l.

1s. 6d. from 100l. to 200l.

2s. from 200l. and upwards.

Upon Notes that shall be re-issuable.

The report was ordered to be received on Monday next.

The Empress of Russia has declared, that she will never suffer Thorne and Dantzic to be separated from the sovereignty of Poland, and that at the first requisition of the republic, she will most readily guarantee all its possessions.

Letters from Breslaw mention, that the Prince de Hohenlohe, Governor of that city has received orders to begin his march on the 4th of May, with a body of 10,000 men, to reinforce the Prussian army.

DUBLIN, May 21.

The Squirrel frigate is again arrived in our harbour on the impress service, after having delivered her cargo of impressed men and volunteers on board the grand fleet at Spithead; she sailed from thence for Cork harbour, where she picked up a number of excellent seamen, and from the Cove of Cork made the harbour of Dublin in one day.

Saturday the three beautiful children of the Right Hon. Mr. Grattan, most providentially escaped destruction within a few yards of their

considerable amount taken thereout, with which the depredators got clear off. We are informed that the first step the villains took to accomplish their purpose, was the breaking the parlour window shutters, which having effected, they entered, and finding the side-door of the shop locked, they unhinged it, without giving the least alarm to the family.

On Monday last, Elizabeth Campbell, aged forty, twenty months pregnant, had a full grown foetus extracted from her by the Cæsarean operation; the poor woman suffered the operation with uncommon fortitude, and appears in a fair way of recovery.

ENNIS, May 19. Last week, John Downes, Esq; Inspector of Excise, assisted by Mr. A. King, and two detachments of the 69th Regt. from Clare Castle, destroyed the following private distilleries:—three at Tulla, where they seized one worm—one at the cross-roads near Tulla, and seized the still, head, and worm—and one near Jasper's pound, where they seized the worm, and spilled large quantities of potale and singling; after which the seizures were brought in here and lodged in his Majesty's stores.

Mr. Downes also conveyed here and lodged in his Majesty's stores, assisted by Messrs Purcell and Redden, Excise Officers, two large Brewing Pans, which they seized at private Breweries in Six mile-bridge.

From Mr. Downes's activity and perseverance, the country in general as well as the fair trader, already feel the benefit of his exertions.
