Extract of a letter from Ayr, May 12.—"A
strong gale from N. W. having blown all last
night, a sloop with herrings from Ireland for
Clyde, attempting to make our harbour at quarter
tide, about noon this day, struck on the bar where
the violence of the surge soon beat out her bottom.
From this dangerous situation Captain Thomas
Wallace, jun. who in innumerable cases of peril
has always stood foremost at the hazard of his life
to assist those in distress, went out with a pilot boat
and five men to their relief, when, after getting
out two of the crew, and running the utmost dan-
ger of being all lost, they with difficulty regained
the harbour. Captain Wallace then got the Life
Boat launched, which had lately arrived here, and
had never been tried, when Captains Porter and
M'Connachie, and nine or ten brave seamen and
carpenters, generously volunteered their exertions
along with him, and with ease and safety reached
the sloop and brought off the remainder of the
crew, affording a convincing proof of the superior
utility of the Life Boats to all others, in situations
of danger, and the comfortable prospect of saving
many valuable lives, which in similar situations,
formerly no exertions could have preserved."
