

Dutch mail due on Friday arrived yesterday, which we are informed, that the departure of Whitworth from Paris had reached Holland and caused a very strong sensation in that city, and a depression of 5 per cent. in their stock.

A general discontent at the measures of the French is said to prevail amongst all ranks of people, on account of the expected stagnation in trade.

Orders have been sent to India, both overland and by a vessel of war, announcing the renewal of treaties, and conveying directions for the occupation of Pondicherry, &c.

Sidney Smith has taken a very rich French merchantman, and sent her into the Downs.

The Diamond frigate has taken a rich ship from the East, and brought her into Portland Roads.

Orders are gone out to Admiral Duckworth, to depart, with the Commanding Officer of his Majesty's forces in Jamaica, an immediate attack on the island of Martinique.
