At his residence, at Quarters town, county Cork, on the 23d instant, Henry Croker, Esq. aged 78, brother of the late Edward Croker, of Ballineagard, in this county, Esq. one of the last surviving officers of those who fought in all the battles of the first American war, and one of the oldest Captains in the army—having obtained that rank in the year 1779. He was appointed to the situation of Brigade Major of Yeomanry in the year 1798, which he held for over thirty years, and was also an old and upright Magistrate of the county Cork.
