## DONDERRY ELECTION.

Appointed for holding this election, he resided for this purpose in the county of Londerry. The proceedings commenced at 10 o'clock. After the reading of the High Sheriff proceeded to ask if there was any candidate to propose.

If you will allow me to place him in the proud position of a member, the dictates of an honest heart, and a devoted mind will be devoted to your service. At the same time, he will carry along with him the sound constitutional principles which characterised his father, (cheers.) I am alluding to the retirement of Sir Robert Bateson. I feel I have but feebly discharged the duty which I have said of him. Perhaps in the future, if my two sons I should not say more, but I feel I would have done my duty had I said less. It remains for me, to propose to you Robert Bateson, Esq. of Park, as a fit and proper person to represent the county in the Imperial Parliament. (cheers.)
