Yesterday evening, between 8 and 9 o'clock, a Police-  
man arrived express from Pallis-Kerry, in this County,  
bringing intelligence of the murder of Edward Hurst,  
Esq. of Shannon-Grove, which was effected within a few  
yards of his house about 6 o'clock the same evening.—  
Every exertion was instantly made by the Police to arrest  
the perpetrators of this foul and assassin-like murder,  
and two persons were apprehended not far from the spot,  
under very suspicious circumstances, one of them having  
on his clothes several marks of fresh blood. Our active  
Police Magistrate, Thomas P. Vokes, Esq. immediately  
set off for the scene of this barbarous outrage, for the pur-  
pose of investigating every particular. No cause has  
been, as yet, assigned for the murder; but any thing  
further that may transpire to elucidate the nature of it,  
shall be communicated to our readers.
