## DEATH OF MR E J O'RIORDAN. V.S.

We regret to announce the death of Mr E. J.  
O'Riordan, Veterinary Surgeon, which took place  
yesterday morning at his residence, Laurel Hill  
Avenue, at the early age of forty years.  
He had been ailing about three months, and it was  
confidently hoped that he would pull through.  
Last week his condition became critical and at  
7 o'clock yesterday morning he passed away to the  
great grief of his wife and young family. Of a  
warm hearted, unassuming disposition, the deceased  
was a general favourite, and his premature demise  
has come as a great shock to a wide circle of friends  
and acquaintances, who sincerely sympathise with  
his widow and children in their irreparable  
loss. Some twelve years ago he obtained his  
degree at the Royal Veterinary College, Dublin,  
and immediately took up practice in the city,  
where his father, the late Mr J O'Riordan, was  
also a veterinary practitioner. He held public  
appointments under the Corporation and Limerick  
No 2 District Council, and enjoyed an ex-  
tensive practice in the city and county, as  
well as in the adjoining County of Clare. He was  
a keen and enthusiastic sportsman, being parti-  
cularly devoted to coursing. He was a member  
of the County Limerick Coursing Club of many  
years standing, and at the Irish Cup reunion he  
was a familiar figure. He held the position of  
Hon Secretary to the Irish Cup Committee for  
some years, and was at the time of his death  
Hon Veterinary Surgeon to the Committee. Among  
coursing men his death will be learned with  
deep sorrow, and especially by followers of the  
leash in Munster, with whom his abilities as a  
successful practitioner in relation to the ailments  
of greyhounds were highly valued.

The remains were removed to St Michael's  
Parochial Church at nine o'clock last night, and  
at two o'clock to day the funeral left for the family  
burial place in Mount St Lawrence Cemetery.  
The cortege was of extremely large proportion,  
and testified to the esteem in which the deceased  
was held, and the sympathy felt for his family in  
the great bereavement they have suffered.
