The morning was ushered in with the ringing of bells, and in the evening the 18^h regiment of Light Dragoons fired three volleys opposite the Court House. Tralee, June 8. Saturday night last, Geo. Rowan, Esq; of Castle-Gregory, a Justice of Peace for this county, and a revenue officer, took an opportunity of intercepting three horses on Dingle road, loaded with six bags of smuggled tobacco, which he seized, and yesterday morning safely lodged in his Majesty's stores; he also spiritedly disarmed some of the party who were in charge of those contraband goods.

Last Monday two boys playing on the grand tower of the castle barrack, one of them suddenly dropped into a small aperture, and descended thirty yards, where he must have perished, if his companion had not brought some soldiers to the spot, who got him out with great difficulty, by letting down a rope.

Tuesday the 9th regiment of Dragoons commanded by Colonel Lefroy, was reviewed near Charleville, by General Paterson, and were highly applauded for their military appearance, and excellent discipline.

This day the 15th regiment, commanded by Col. Myers, was reviewed at Loughmore, by General Paterson, and on Saturday will march for Ross Castle, Dingle and Millstreet. The regiment being complete made a very fine appearance, and performed their evolutions entirely to the satisfaction of the General and a numerous concourse of spectators.

The 4th regiment, consisting of about 170 recruits, arrived from England last week, and is quartered in Kinsale.
