We are sorry to announce the complete destruction of one of the Rope Houses in Plymouth Dockyard, by fire, on Monday morning. The Rope-house, perhaps, the finest and longest in Europe, and nearly 1200 feet in length, exhibited at one time, with the exemption of an inconsiderable quantity at each end, one tremendous line of flame. The general opinion is, that the fire proceeded from the hemp, but that it was not, by any means, the work of an incendiary. The damage sustained by this tremendous fire is estimated at £25,000.

Thus adhering to our undeviating path of strict impartiality, our readers will have information on which they can place firm dependance, whereby they can decide with precision.

On Thursday, Lord Sidmouth as Home Secretary, and Earl Bathurst as War Secretary, were sworn into office—these with the appointments of Lord Liverpool and Mr. Vansittart, are the only situations which are publicly announced as having been filled, but we believe that the list of the Ministry which appeared in our last will be found correct.
