

Sir James Keppel, G. C. B. the Forces in Nova Scotia, having General Order of Militia, May 27, 1820:—

It is necessary, for many reasons, to establish in conformity to the Province.—It is ordered, that there shall be in each County, of which the Establishment is one Lieutenant-Colonel, two Majors, 10 and 20 Second Lieutenants, with the company composed of one Captain, two Lieutenants, one Clerk, four Serjeants, and 100 men. All Officers who may be engaged up the Regiments shall retain their rank. In consideration of the population, tax, and the extent of that County, there shall be in Down, one in Colchester, and one in Drogheda to provide for the care of the Harbours and shall be formed a Militia Company

The Post Office has in contemplation improvements in the direct line between London and Waterford. A duel was fought at Cork, between J. and T. O'Connor, Esq. after an adjournment the business in dispute was decided.

On the 18th last, the following notice was given, at Mr. Wilson's Nursery, on the road:—"Notice to all strangers to remove their own places before this day, or to be removed by me, or my agents, or any person remaining on the premises, on the 22d day of July, 1820, Captain Wilson, pursuant to this notice, a party of men from the house of Michael Carty, who was in care of the Nursery—they went to force the gate, and then pelted the windows, from which they were beat off by the fidelity of Carty and an assistant, and afterwards pursued them on the road. One named Ryan, was shot through the head, and now lying in the County Hospital. He was advanced to the dignity of Baron Gwydir, Co. Carmarvon, May 24, 1796.
