ANOTHER BARBAROUS MURDER—An Inquest was held
on Saturday last, at Bogmount, in this County, on the body
of John Collins, an independent farmer, but unfortunately
for him supposed to belong to one of those clans or factions,
which still outrage the peace of the country, and set the laws
at defiance. Collins was on his way home from the fair of
Abbeyfeale, where he had been on business, and was followed,
waylaid, and brutally murdered by persons of an opposite
party, who broke his head with stones. A verdict of wilful
murder was returned against John Leahy, and John M'Carthy,
and against another John Leahy, and others, for aiding and
assisting in said murder. A report had reached Newcastle
on Friday morning, of the murder of Collins, when James
Armstrong, Esq. C.C. lost not a moment in proceeding to
Abbeyfeale, where he succeeded in obtaining information of
the murderers, and had John M'Carthy arrested, left him in
charge of the Police on that station until after the inquest.
He is fully identified and lodged in the bridewell of New-
castle. This murder was perpetrated about 8 o'clock on the
fair evening, a short time only after the Military and Police
had retired.

Thomas Ryan, at the close of the fair of Ballybrood, last
week, was struck with a stone which fractured his head.
An elderly man of the name of Morony was seen in a
dying state on Monday evening in a lane off Upper William-
street, and, before proper assistance could be got, he expired.
The Mayor held an inquest on his remains at the Exchange
yesterday—Verdict, that he died by the visitation of God.
