A letter from Mr. Richard Alley, who is appointed Surgeon to the Lady Juliana transport: now in the Downes, under sailing orders for Port Jackson, in Botany Bay, says, "On board this vessel there are two hundred and twenty-eight females, besides children—the youngest convict is but 12 years, the oldest 68.—A ship of war, of 44 guns, commanded by Captain Ryan, goes out with provisions for the settle-ment."

Last Thursday a flock of several thousands of Goldfinches were seen flying over the New Bridge; they are expected to return in about a month.

Yesterday evening Lieutenant General Massy arrived at his seat at Elm; and John Prendergast Smyth, Esq; one of the Members in Parliament for this city, at his house on the North Strand—both from Dublin.
