

QUARTER SESSIONS.

The City Quarter Sessions were opened with the usual formalities, at the Tholsel Court, by the Mayor, — Aldermen Watson, and Sir C. Carter Magistrates, in their scarlet robes of red lined by the High Constable, and the Serjeants in their black robes, and red cloaks trimmed with ermine. On this occasion the Court was much crowded, and the following gentlemen were sworn on the Bench — Francis P. Russell, foreman, Jeffrey M. Gavin, John O'Brien, Patrick M'Namara, M. Robinson, David Hunt, Henry White, James A. Meade, James Alton, George John Gunson, Martin Honan, Charles Michael Quinn, William Erson, George Goggin, James Gavin, Arthur Gloster, Alexander M'Connell, and William Ryan, Esqrs.

The Mayor informed the Grand Jury, that a considerable number of Bills were ready to go before them, and that the members would not leave their room, and disposed of such as would be sent up to the Bench to expedite the public business. The Bench adjourned on Tuesday, and proceeded with the trials. The Market Jury panel was then called on, and the following persons having answered to their names, were sworn accordingly: —

John Doherty, Joseph Molony, Denis Ryan, James M'Connell, John Fitzgibbon, Thomas Tinsley, James Michael Donovan, William O'Sullivan, John M. Keating, and Zachariah Myles.

The Mayor, in addressing the Market Jurors, said, he desired to be presented with extracts of the Acts of Parliament, to inform them fully of the nature and extent of the duties confided to them, and the powers they were to exercise. They were bound by the Oath they had sworn to discharge those duties, to the best of their ability, and without favor or affection, in conformity with the range of the law. There were many in the City, perhaps, of more real importance to the public, than that of a good Market Juror; but it was of such moment that its exercise should be attended with a corresponding energy and exertion, that he hoped they would act conscientiously, and give every assistance from him, in protecting the poor, and punishing the imposition of the law, whose practices, at this particular season, he had carefully looked after. He again declared his desire to see them every aid for this purpose, by the Constables or Police.

The Court was then adjourned to Tuesday next.

44 Bills of Indictment—12 were yesterday returned; the remainder were either ignored or the defendants did not appear.

The Sessions, on Monday, the Mayor, Sir C. Carter, and Captain Drought presided.—Several persons drunk and disorderly on the Sabbath were brought before the Bench, in mitigated penalties of 5s. and two were committed for non-payment.

The Mayor, Alderman Sir C. Marrett, and Rev. J. M. Marrett presided, this day, at Petty Sessions. Marrett was ordered informations against Mary Flanagan, assaulting her, and throwing a jar of vitriol on her. Thomas Corbett, v. Isaac Galbraith, John M. Cleary, Card-makers, for attempting to take an unlawful oath—postponed by the Bench to the next July, as the new Combination Act of the last year, in whose jurisdiction this offence comes, has not yet received. Edmund Kinevane, for assaulting M'Inerney, a crown witness, was remanded, to give 48 hours notice of bail. Three Publicans convicted of selling spirits and porter on the Sabbath severally find £2 10s. £2. and £1.

The Court was ordered to find bail for assaulting a man of the name of Carroll, and the Court adjourned to the next day, after dismissing several cases in which there was no appearance.

The Mayor inflicted a mitigated penalty of 5s. on a Pawnbroker, for knowingly receiving stolen goods.
