In 1812, that is 16 years before the Catholic Emancipation Act was passed, the landlords of Clare, including George Ross-Lewin of Fortfergus, were unanimous in a petition in the bill's favour. You published a few years ago a list of the names, but alas few now remain. The younger members of these Co. Clare families invariably joined the army or navy, and two of the Fortfergus clan were at Waterloo, and one the Adjutant of the 9th, was killed at San Sebastian. In the famel years of 1847 8 members of the family preserved the lives of all who lived in Coolteenagowan, and I have often met with the children or grandchildren of these poor people, who are now prosperous citizens of the United States. Now, that from King to poorest subject we are all praying for peace and quietness, I am glad, after a long life in the land nigh Shannon, to add my testimony as to the happy relations which existed at Fortfergus, Corofiel, and Coolteenagowan between every class and creed.
