FUNERAL OF MRS O'BRIEN STUDDERT.

The remains of the late Mrs Maria Frances O'Brien Studdert were interred yesterday in the family burial place at Kilnascolagh, Newmarket-on-Fergus, in presence of a considerable body of mourners. The deceased lady was wife of Mr Robert O'Brien Studdert, D.L., Cullane, Kilkishen, and in that district she was held in the highest regard by every section of the community. She was a lady beloved by everyone with whom she came in contact, and her death, which took place on Tuesday at 3 Pery Square, Limerick, the residence of her son-in-law, Dr F W Kennedy, has come as a great shock to her family and a wide circle of friends. The funeral left Pery Square at half past ten yesterday morning for Kilnascolagh, and was representative and influential.
