James Tracy, a labourer, employed yesterday taking down some stone pilasters from the old Mayoralty house, was forced to the earth by the weight of one, and with such resistless pressure, as to cause compound fracture of the leg; between laceration and fracture this wound is so bad, that the poor man must, it is feared, submit to amputation of the limb.

Richard Keane, an elderly man of delicate appearance, and reduced circumstances, walked into a public house at Ballinacurra, on Monday night, where he immediately complained of sickness, and died in a few minutes. Aldermen Mahony and Piercy held an inquest upon his remains yesterday. Verdict—Died by the visitation of God.

Last evening, a boat-man named M'Mahon, fell into the Maigue at the Ferry-bridge, near Clarina, and before any assistance could be rendered him, he unfortunately perished.

Two cows, which were seized for tythes from an opulent farmer in the vicinity of Clonlara, Doonas, were offered for public sale there on Monday, in presence of a vast concourse of peasantry, who congregated from miles about to the scene. A troop of the 3d Light Dragoons, from this garrison, was ordered to Clonlara in case of tumult, but if any refractory feeling did exist, it was overawed by the presence of two Magistrates and the Military; accordingly the sale proceeded without interruption, and the cows were knocked down for £17, which was even beyond the tythe demand.

A tailor of the name of Patrick Welsh, hanged himself at Monegea, near Newcastle, on Saturday last. An inquest was held on view of the body by John Cox, Esq. Coroner, on Monday, when it came out in evidence that Welsh for the last six weeks seemed quite melancholy, and often expressed a wish that he was either hanged or drowned. He effected his purpose with a horse's halter, one end of which he tied to the rafter of a stable, ascended the manger, tied the other end round his neck, and threw himself off; he was found thus suspended and quite dead, his feet not more than three inches from the floor. Verdict—insanity.

An industrious man named James Kelly had his arm desperately fractured on Monday last, in a quarry at Newcastle, while undermining a large stone, which unexpectedly fell on him. It is feared the arm must be amputated at the shoulder.

The troops from Newcastle, under Captain Thurlow, 90th Light Infantry, accompanied by Chief Constable Armstrong and a party of police, proceeded in heavy marching order to the fair of Purl, 12 miles distant, on Monday morning, and they were billeted in Abbeyfeale that night. What a state the country must be in, when a fair or market cannot be held without the presence of a military and police force, to protect peaceable subjects in the course of their ordinary business in such places.
