7s 2d; red currant, raspberry, and red currant,  
1s 0d, 1s 1d, 2s 10d, and 6s 7d; raspberry  
and gooseberry, and strawberry and gooseberry,  
1s, 1s 10d, 2s 10d, 6s 6d; gooseberry, goose-  
berry and red currant, 1s 1d, 1s 10d, 2s 8d, 6s  
3d; black currant and apple, raspberry and  
apple, raspberry and plum, strawberry and apple,  
rhubarb and raspberry, rhubarb and strawberry,  
1d, 1s 9d, 2s 7d, 6s 0d; rhubarb and apple,
