The Hon. C. H. Wandesforde, is foreman of the Kilkenny county grand jury, and Richard Sullivan, Esq. M.P. of the city.

Thomas Costelloe, Esq. Coroner, held an inquest on the body of a man named John Quin, of Knocknena, near Abington, who met with his death by a fall at Ulla, when the horse took fright and galloped away. The jury found a verdict of accidental death.

Henry Martin, a steward of Wm. Lloyd, Esq. of Tower-hill, dropped dead while he was with some men mowing hay.

The Rev. R. G. Holt has got £100 damages at Athy assizes against the Great Southern and Western company, for injuries by a fall off the platform at Portarlington when leaving the train, and without a light to guide passengers.

Rev. Mr. Hutchinson, Wesleyan minister, is the dissenting chaplain appointed by the board of superintendence to Castlebar gaol. Rev. Mr. Brown, Protestant minister, applied at the assizes to oppose the presentment for his salary as such, but Baron Green said he was of opinion the appointment was good in the words of the act, "Protestant dissenting minister" being a general application.
