GENERAL PROVISIONS.
11. (1) It shall not be lawful for any person—
(i) To carry, lead, or drive, or cause or permit to
be carried, led, or driven, a horse, ass, or mule
affected with or suspected of Parasitic Mange on
a highway or thoroughfare; or (ii) to move any
carcase or hide, or part of a carcase or hide, of a
horse, ass, or mule affected with or suspected of
Parasitic Mange on a highway or thoroughfare;
or (iii) to expose any horse, ass, or mule affected
with or suspected of Parasitic Mange in a market,
fair, or saleyard where horses, asses, or mules are
from time to time exposed for sale; or (iv) to
place any horse, ass, or mule affected with or
suspected of Parasitic Mange in a lair or stable or
other place where horses, asses, or mules are
commonly placed before or after exposure for sale
or for transit by railway or sea; or (v) to con-
sign or cause to be consigned or carried on a
railway or vessel any horse, ass, or mule affected
with or suspected of Parasitic Mange; or (vi) to
place or keep a horse, ass, or mule affected with or
suspected of Parasitic Mange on common or unin-
closed land, or in a field or other place insufficiently
fenced, or in a field or other place adjoining a high-
way, unless adequate precautions have been and
are being observed to prevent the affected or sus-
pected horse, ass, or mule coming in contact with
any horse, ass, or mule on such highway or grazing
on the side thereof.

(2) But this Article shall operate subject to any
provision of this Order providing for or directing
the movement of horses, asses, or mules, or car-
cases or hides, in cases therein mentioned.

OFFENCES.

19. (1) If a horse, ass, or mule, carcase or hide,
or part of a carcase or hide, or other thing is
moved or exposed in contravention of this Order,
or of a Notice given under this Order, the owner
of the horse, ass, or mule, carcase or hide, or part
of a carcase or hide, or other thing, and the
person for the time being in charge thereof, and
the person causing, directing, or permitting the
movement and the person moving or conveying
the horse, ass, or mule, carcase, or other thing
and the consignee or other person receiving or
keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in
contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the
place from which the horse, ass, or mule, carcase
or hide, or part of a carcase or hide, or other
thing is moved, shall, each according to and in re-
spect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty
of an offence against the Act of 1894. (2) If any-
thing is omitted to be done as regards the cleans-
ing or disinfection of any place or thing in contra-
vention of this Order, the owner and the lessee,
and the occupier of the place, and the owner of
the thing, shall, each according to and in respect
of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of
an offence against the Act of 1894.

PENALTIES.

24. This Order extends to the whole of Ireland.
Other provisions of the order prescribe the
restrictive motion to be taken by Inspectors of the
Local Authority in cases of disease or suspected
disease; require the curative or preventive treat-
ment of animals, and the cleansing and disinfection
of infected premises; define the effects of Restrictive
Notices; prescribe the conditions on which
animals may be released from certain restrictions,
or restrictions applying to premises removed, etc.
etc.
