

An affair of honour was to have been determined yesterday afternoon, between Captain Towry, and Sign Courtenay, of the Guards. The parties met about five o'clock in the afternoon, near the mile stone on the Edgware road, but private information of their intentions being communicated to Mr. Bond, he caused the parties to be taken into custody on the spot, who were afterwards brought before him at Bow-street, and obliged to produce securities for keeping the peace.

A letter from Rotterdam, dated July 16, states as follows:—"On Saturday and Sunday last several vessels arrived in Brielle, with cargoes of Colonial produce, tobacco, &c. clearing in from Embour and other neutral ports, which were all stopped by a French vessel, and on each of them a French guard has been put, to prevent any part of their cargoes from being landed, or disposed of, by the consignees."

The four French men of war from St. Domingo, which got into Ferrol, carried in with them the great Extra-Indiaman, Captain Mooring, from London for Bengal. The capture was made on the 18th ult. near the Madeiras.

We are sorry to announce the loss of the Lady Hobart packet, from New York, on the 28th June, in an Island of Ice, in lat. 46. long. 44. The passengers and crew were fortunately saved, and were arrived at Newfoundland.

We are happy to find, that there is no truth in the report of the capture of the Juno frigate. It is a small transport of the same name that was taken.

The Hazard of 18 guns, Captain Neve, reported some of the daily papers to have been captured, and safe last Saturday in the Channel, with the In- men; letters of that date have been received from Captain Neve.

Aug. 5.]—This morning we received French journals to the 1st inst. inclusive. It appears by an article in the Moniteur, that part of the St. Domingo squadron, consisting of five sail of the line, under the command of Rear-Admiral Bedout, were destroyed on the 16th of July. The place where they were destroyed is not mentioned, but some of the other Journals state, at Corunna, in Spain.—The Dido, from Madaloupe, is said to have arrived also at the same time.

An article in the Moniteur, dated Naples, July 25, charges Sir Alexander Ball, the Governor of Malta, with having been so intoxicated with joy, when he received intelligence of the commencement of hostilities, that he ordered serenades to be given in the streets, and caused the windows of the Villa de Busy, the Envoy of the Grand Master, and of some other persons, to be broken with stones. He accuses him of other atrocities, which no person acquainted with the character of a British Naval Officer will believe.
