It was on Wednesday reported, and we be-  
lieve with some truth, that the Lord Chancellor

On the 31st July, at Trim Assizes, where  
was tried before the Hon. Mr. Justice Kelly,  
and a most respectable Jury, composed of many  
of the most respectable gentlemen of the county  
of Meath, a cause of the utmost importance to  
the agriculture and corn trade of this country.

This trial was between David Jebb, Esq;  
plaintiff, and John Finigan, of Moymet, farmer,  
defendant, on an action brought by the plaintiff  
for damages against the defendant, for not de-  
livering 20 barrels of wheat sold by sample at  
the mills of Slane in December last, which de-  
fendant sold again at another mill for an ad-  
vanced price.

Mr. Jebb proved by his clerk the sale of the  
wheat and the delivery of the sample to the sa-  
tisfaction of the Court and Jury. The Judge  
pointed out in the most forcible manner the  
great advantages to agriculture by the establish-  
ment of those markets, for the farmer, all over  
the kingdom, the good effects of which could  
only be maintained by integrity and punctuality  
in fulfilling all bargains made there, and charged  
the Jury accordingly, who found a verdict for  
Mr. Jebb, without quitting the box, with da-  
mages and costs.
