To the Editor of the Limerick Chronicle.

SIR,—Having read in your paper of last Saturday, that 191 Converts from Protestantism to Popery, had been confirmed in the County of Monaghan, by the Roman Catholic Bishop, E. Kernan, last July; I beg to observe that confirmations in the Church of Rome, are not held oftener than once in seven years, although they may and frequently are deferred for a longer period: so that this number of conformists must have been, at least, the gathering of seven years, and probably of a much longer time.

Again, Sir, the Protestant population of Monaghan cannot be rated at less than one hundred and fifty thousand, and of course there must be a vast proportion of mixed marriages, one party being Protestant, the other Roman Catholic.

The result of such marriages is generally the same in all parts of Ireland; the Protestant party is mostly dra-gooned into a compliance with the religious forms of the Church of Rome, and it would be satisfactory to know what number of the County of Monaghan converts, during seven years, come under this description.
