place the flood had rifen to no less a height than four feet in every house; many of the wretched inhabitants of cabbins, who were confined to ground floors were obliged to quit with their children, leaving their little furnivere, &c. to the mercy of the waters. Is being market day, and the weather extremely fine, the town was confequently much crouded, which added confiderably to the confusion; all were in alarm ! - mothers running promifeuoully, they knew not where fcreaming for the supposed loss of their offspring-husbands in fearch of wives and children-horses, some with and others without riders, driving thro' the streets; in thort, every face wore the marks of distraction, not knowing what to impute the cause of their alarm; some without giving themselves time to confider what course the waters took, thought the fea was pouring in upon them, while others more ignorant imagined the world at an end.

At fix the flood began to fall, and at eight the river was very little higher than it usually is at this featon of the year; however, notwithstanding this general confusion, there was but one life loft, which was that of a young man of the name of Cronin, who happening to fland on the battlement of a small bridge opposite the New-Gaol, was called to by a poor woman to affilt her getting up alfo, on which he humanely reached her his hand, but the woman, becoming alarmed at the rapid motion of the water, and letting go her hold, the unhappy man fell back into the river, and was instantly hurried under the Parade arch and drowned. His fate is the more to be lamented, a we are informed he was the only Support of a mother and three younger children, who have now to depend on the bounty of the benevolent. After a diligent fearch, his remains were next morning found, near a mile diltant from the town.
